

RESOLUTION

(Adopted by the 1963 Convention delegates)

Commendation of Dropout Study and Efforts to Remove Causes

WHEREAS: there is increasing awareness of the number of children dropping out of school between kindergarten and the twelfth grade; and

WHEREAS: there is also awareness that this number of dropouts represents a serious loss to the development of the worth and dignity of those individuals and also a loss in the potential strength of the manpower of the nation; therefore

RESOLVED: that the Colorado Congress of Parents and Teachers commend the effort behind the current study as to the causes and solutions of the problem of dropouts;

RESOLVED: that the Colorado State Department of Education, local district school boards, school administrators, and teachers also be commended for their serious efforts to cut the number of dropouts to a minimum.

The committee recommends that this resolution be adopted.
