

1976 WINTER OLYMPIC GAMES

- WHEREAS, Denver has been selected as the site for the 1976 Winter Olympic games; and
- WHEREAS, Elected officials and renowned civic leaders of Denver and Colorado were active in gaining the Olympics for Denver; and
- WHEREAS, The sponsors of the games by word and deed have shown that they are mindful of the concerns of citizens potentially affected by the games; and
- WHEREAS, The sponsors have committed themselves to abide by guidelines that conform to wholesome ecological results; and
- WHEREAS, It is appropriate to bring this prestigious event to Colorado on the 100th Anniversary of its statehood; and
- WHEREAS, It is symbolic that on the 200th Anniversary of the Declaration of Independence we will find athletes and visitors from all over the world coming to Colorado to participate in the events or to view these in a free society; and
- WHEREAS, The Olympic games do provide an avenue for world understanding and a model of peaceful relationships; and
- WHEREAS, The Olympic games will provide opportunities for valuable learning experiences for students, educational staff, parents and other citizens; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the Colorado Congress of Parents and Teachers Association heartily endorse the 1976 Olympic games scheduled to be held in Colorado, and commit themselves to help these games realize the high expectations that local, national, and international citizens have for the Olympic games.
