Colorado PTA Legislative Committee

The Colorado <u>PTA Legislative Committee</u> normally meets on both the 2nd and 4th Mondays from January through April, during the annual session of the State Legislature (Colorado General Assembly), and on the 2nd Mondays during the other months.

Anyone interested in joining meetings of the committee who is not already receiving messages about them should contact Evie Hudak, Public Policy Director, at <u>legislative@copta.org</u> to receive announcements from the committee. PTA members who attend 3 or more meetings per year are entitled to vote at the meetings. Every PTA Council is supposed to have a Legislative Chair and every PTA local unit is supposed to have an Advocacy Liaison. These are the people who automatically receive information from the Legislative Committee with the agenda, minutes, and other relevant committee information.

PTA's Position on School Reopening

The Colorado PTA Board of Directors approved a position statement on School Reopening and COVID. In brief, the statement includes the following:

- Recommends that school buildings remain closed during the COVID-19 pandemic unless they are open in accordance with all public health guidelines.
- Urges state and federal government officials to provide funding for improvements that allow conformance with public health guidelines and funding for reliable broadband internet access.
- Advocates for high-quality remote learning options to be available for all students and families.
- Supports parents, educators, and students having input and involvement in decision-making for school reopening.

The Network is focused on these three bills that all associations are in agreement with:

- Pause statewide CMAS Testing for the Spring of 2021,
- · Conduct a third-party audit of our State Accreditation System, and
- Give teachers one more year to complete important course work required by the READ Act.
