National PTA Reflections is America's oldest and largest arts education program of its kind. The program was developed in 1969 by Colorado's PTA President Mary Lou Anderson to encourage students to explore their talents and express themselves. Since then, the Reflections Program has inspired millions of students to reflect on a specific theme and create original artwork. Why is arts education so important? It not only cultivates imagination, self-expression, and creativity, but it also plays an important role in the development of critical thinking and problem-solving skills. It also helps students process their thoughts and emotions – which is so important to mental health – especially now.

Each year, students in Grades Pre-K through 12 and "Special Artists" are recognized for bringing the theme to life through <u>film</u> <u>production</u>, <u>dance choreography</u>, <u>literature</u>, <u>music composition</u>, <u>photography</u>, <u>and visual arts (2D and 3D)</u>.

Students advance through their schools, regions/councils, state, and national reviews. It is a way for everyone to create and for student artists to express themselves and be recognized.


Consider the following:

KEEP THE HEART OF PTA BEATING with **ADVOCACY** in SEPTEMBER

As students go back to school in September, we need PTA members to remember that our mission is to make every child's potential a reality by advocating for all children. Here are the things you can do <u>now</u> to help accomplish our mission:

Register to vote!

This fall's ballot will impact things that are important to PTA: school board elections and statewide ballot issues affecting school funding. It is essential that all eligible PTA members are able to vote. To register to vote or to ensure that you are already registered and your registration is up to date – go to www.GoVoteColorado.gov.

School board elections!

With Colorado's extensive "local control" of policies, curriculum, hiring, and school buildings by school boards in our 178 school districts around the state, it is vital that PTA members pay attention to who is running for school board in their district. Typically the seats on school boards are staggered, so that about half the seats are up every oddnumbered year. As a 501c3 nonprofit organization, PTA is somewhat restricted in what it can do regarding these elections. We CANNOT support or oppose candidates, but we CAN provide information to our members about the candidates who are running. See our Election Guide for School Board Elections for details.

Vote NO on this year's statewide ballot issues!

While there has been no confirmation as of the time this article was written as to whether the proposed statewide ballot issues will be approved for the 2021 ballot, and if so, what their Proposition numbers will be, we believe they are likely to be approved. PTA is opposed to all:

- **VOTE NO on LEAP (Initiative 25, Learning** Enrichment and Academic Progress): See the flyer in this newsletter or the article in the August edition for more information.
- VOTE NO on Initiative 19, Requirements for **Spending Custodial Money:** This ballot measure would transfer the power to allocate "custodial funds" from the executive branch (Governor, State Treasurer, and heads of state departments and agencies) to the State Legislature. "Custodial funds" means money received by the state provided for a particular purpose, which originated from a source other than the state taxes, such as federal funds and grants. Therefore, in order to access these funds in a timely manner, the part-time Legislature would have to be called back into numerous special sessions at a cost of \$25,000/day; otherwise, the money in the custodial funds would remain inaccessible and unspent until the following January when the Legislature reconvenes. Thus, it may result in reduced or delayed public services such as allocation of grant funding that schools would want.
- **VOTE NO on Initiative 27, Property Tax** Assessment Rate Reduction and Voter-Approved Revenue Change: This ballot measure would reverse the adjustments to property tax assessment rates made by Amendment B in last year's election, which was approved by nearly two-thirds of Colorado voters. The initiative would slash local government revenue by over \$1 billion annually through lowering property tax rates, and in the process affecting schools, police, and fire protection, among other services. It would also create a confusing clash with property tax law passed through SB21-293.

DECLINE TO SIGN Initiative 31, State Income Tax Reduction – Colorado PTA OPPOSES this ballot measure that would hurt education funding!

We see paid petition gatherers in front of our grocery stores, at festivals, and in other public spaces all the time. It's how tax policy decisions are often made in our state. But instead of asking you to sign a petition to help our kids and schools as we often do, this time we are asking you to do the opposite: DO **NOT** sign the petition for Initiative 31!

Proponents of this measure are currently gathering signatures for the 2022 ballot. Initiative 31, State Income Tax Reduction, would further cut funding for our schools. Colorado already has one of the lowest rates of income tax in the nation. This ballot issue would reduce the funds available for public schools by about \$400 million annually and give much of it to the wealthiest Coloradans. That's the equivalent of 7,000 teachers!

We know 2022 might seem like a long way off, but successfully challenging a measure like this takes a lot of time and energy. It starts with pledging *to decline to sign* the petition for Initiative 31 and telling your friends, family members, and coworkers about this dangerous measure.

- Why do we have to keep paying fees and raising money to keep the basics for our students?
